Remembering Doug Grant

The White Ribbon team learned with great sadness that SAS soldier and White Ribbon Rider Doug Grant was killed in Afghanistan on 20 August. Doug lived and died a hero, attempting to save captives from insurgents in Kabul, and promoting a violence-free life for women in New Zealand. Doug's warm personality, commitment, and integrity will be sorely missed during this year's ride and in the years to come. His contribution abroad and at home to promoting peace amongst people is highly commendable and a legacy his family can be proud of.

Celebrating 20 Years

This year White Ribbon campaigns around the world will celebrate 20 years of promoting a violence free world for women. In 1991, following the massacre of 14 women at a Canadian polytechnic, a handful of men decided they had a responsibility to urge men to speak out. 


White Ribbon T-shirts


Giant Ribbon Pledge Project
